Todd Liebman is originally from Milwaukee, Wisconsin where he grew up. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee with a Bachelor of Arts in History, the University of Wisconsin – Madison with a Juris Doctorate, and the United States Army War College with a Masters in Strategic Studies. Mr. Liebman has been a practicing attorney for almost 30 years. He served over 34 years in the active Army and Army Reserve retiring in 2018 as a Lieutenant Colonel. He is a veteran of service in the Iraq War. Mr. Liebman was the Sauk County Corporation Counsel for 23 years where he was the senior civil law attorney for a medium size Wisconsin county. During that time, Mr. Liebman served in a variety of civic and professional positions including serving as President of the Sauk County Historical Society, President of the Sauk County Bar Association, President of the Wisconsin Association of County Corporation Counsel, and Post Judge Advocate for VFW Post 987. He is currently a member of the National Security Committee of the International Law Division of the American Bar Association.

Mr. Liebman has had a lifelong interest in railroads, and is a strong supporter of improved rail passenger service in America and in Arizona. His interest in railroads was initially primed by having the Shoreline Subdivision of the Chicago & North Western in the backyard of his childhood home. Since then, has ridden almost every Amtrak route since the early 1970s, and has ridden trains throughout Europe and across Canada. Mr. Liebman currently lives in Sierra Vista, Arizona where he is a supervisory attorney for the U.S. Government.
